1Ti 6:6

But piety with contentment is great gain.

1Ti 6:7

For we brought nothing into this world, and it is certain we can carry nothing out.

1Ti 6:8

And having food and raiment let us be therewith content.

Sir 29:21

The chief thing for life is water, and bread, and clothing, and an house to cover shame.

1Ti 6:9

But they that will be rich fall into temptation and a snare, and *into* many foolish and hurtful lusts, which drown men in destruction and perdition.

Mar 10:24

And the disciples were astonished at his words. But Yache answereth again, and saith unto them, Children, how hard is it for them that trust in riches to enter into the kingdom of Alahayim!

Mar 10:25

It is easier for a camel to go through the eye of a needle, than for a rich man to enter into the kingdom of Alahayim.

1Ti 6:10

For the love of money is the root of all evil: which while some coveted after, they have erred from the faith, and pierced themselves through with many sorrows.

1Ti 6:11

But thou, O man of Alahayim, flee these things; and follow after righteousness, alahayimliness, faith, love, patience, meekness.



Polycarp 4:1

But the love of money is the beginning of all troubles. Knowing therefore that we brought nothing into the world neither can we carry anything out, let us arm ourselves with the armor of righteousness, and let us teach ourselves first to walk in the commandment of the Lord;

Polycarp 4:2

and then our wives also, to walk in the faith that hath been given unto them and in love and purity, cherishing their own husbands in all truth and loving all men equally in all chastity, and to train their children in the training of the fear of Alahayim

Eph 5:23 For the husband is the head of the wife, even as Christ is the head of the church: and he is the saviour of the body.

Eph 5:25 Husbands, love your wives, even as Meshiyacha also loved the church, and gave himself for it;

Mat 11:29 Take my yoke upon you, and learn of me; for I am meek and lowly in heart: and ye shall find rest unto your souls.

Mar 8:34 And when he had called the people unto him with his disciples also, he said unto them, Whosoever will come after me, let him deny himself, and take up his cross, and follow me.

Mar 8:35 For whosoever will save his life shall lose it; but whosoever shall lose his life for my sake and the gospel's, the same shall save it.

Rom 6:4 Therefore we are buried with him by baptism into death: that like as Christ was raised up from the dead by the glory of the Father, even so we also should walk in newness of life.

Rom 6:12 Let not sin therefore reign in your mortal body, that ye should obey it in the lusts thereof.

Gal 5:19 Now the works of the flesh are manifest, which are *these*; Adultery, fornication, uncleanness, lasciviousness,

Gal 5:20

Idolatry, witchcraft, hatred, variance, emulations, wrath, strife, seditions, heresies,

Gal 5:21 Envyings, murders, drunkenness, revellings, and such like: of the which I tell you before, as I have also told *you* in time past, that they which do such things shall not inherit the kingdom of Alahayim.

Rom 6:13 Neither yield ye your members as instruments of unrighteousness unto sin: but yield yourselves unto Alahayim, as those that are alive from the dead, and your members as instruments of righteousness unto Alahayim.

Eph 5:9 (For the fruit of the Spirit is in all goodness and righteousness and truth;)

Gal 5:22

But the fruit of the Spirit is love, joy, peace, longsuffering, gentleness, goodness, faith, Gal 5:23

Meekness, temperance: against such there is no law.

Gal 5:24

And they that are Christ's have crucified the flesh with the affections and lusts.

Gal 5:25 If we live in the Spirit, let us also walk in the Spirit.

Having the understanding darkened, being alienated from the life of Alahayim through the ignorance that is in them, because of the blindness of their heart:

Eph 4:19

Who being past feeling have given themselves over unto lasciviousness, to work all uncleanness with greediness.

Eph 4:20-21

But ye have not so learned Christ; If so be that ye have heard him, and have been taught by him, as the truth is in Yache:

Eph 4:22

That ye put off concerning the former conversation the old man, which is corrupt according to the deceitful lusts;

Eph 4:23

And be renewed in the spirit of your mind;

Eph 4:24

And that ye put on the new man, which after Alahayim is created in righteousness and true holiness.

Eph 4:25

Wherefore putting away lying, speak every man truth with his neighbour: for we are members one of another.

Eph 4:26

Be ye angry, and sin not: let not the sun go down upon your wrath:

Eph 4:27

Neither give place to the devil.

Eph 4:29

Let no corrupt communication proceed out of your mouth, but that which is good to the use of edifying, that it may minister grace unto the hearers.



Col 3:8

But now ye also put off all these; anger, wrath, malice, blasphemy, filthy communication out of your mouth.
