



Advent of the Passover

Jasher 80:1

1. AND at the end of two years, Ahayah again sent Moses to Pharaoh to bring forth the children of Israel, and to send them out of the land of Egypt.

Exodus 6:13

And Ahayah spake unto Moses and unto Aaron, and gave them a charge unto the children of Israel, and unto Pharaoh king of Egypt, to bring the children of Israel out of the land of Egypt.

Exodus 7:15

Get thee unto Pharaoh in the morning; lo, he goeth out unto the water; and thou shalt stand by the river's brink against he come; and the rod which was turned to a serpent shalt thou take in thine hand.

Exodus 7:16

And thou shalt say unto him, Ahayah Alahayim of the Hebrews hath sent me unto thee, saying, Let my people go, that they may serve me in the wilderness: and, behold, hitherto thou wouldest not hear.

Exodus 7:17

Thus saith Ahayah, In this thou shalt know that I am Ahayah: behold, I will smite with the rod that is in mine hand upon the waters which are in the river, and they shall be turned to blood.

Exodus 7:18 And the fish that is in the river shall die, and the river shall stink; and the Egyptians shall lothe to drink of the water of the river.

Exodus 7:19

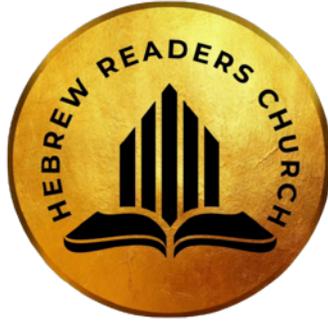
And Ahayah spake unto Moses, Say unto Aaron, Take thy rod, and stretch out thine hand upon the waters of Egypt, upon their streams, upon their rivers, and upon their ponds, and upon all their pools of water, that they may become blood; and that there may be blood throughout all the land of Egypt, both in vessels of wood, and in vessels of stone.

Exodus 7:20

And Moses and Aaron did so, as Ahayah commanded; and he lifted up the rod, and smote the waters that were in the river, in the sight of Pharaoh, and in the sight of his servants; and all the waters that were in the river were turned to blood.

Exodus 7:25

And seven days were fulfilled, after that Ahayah had smitten the river.



Exodus 8:1

And Ahayah spake unto Moses, Go unto Pharaoh, and say unto him, Thus saith Ahayah, Let my people go, that they may serve me.

Exodus 8:2

And if thou refuse to let them go, behold, I will smite all thy borders with frogs:

Exodus 8:5

And Ahayah spake unto Moses, Say unto Aaron, Stretch forth thine hand with thy rod over the streams, over the rivers, and over the ponds, and cause frogs to come up upon the land of Egypt.

Exodus 8:6

And Aaron stretched out his hand over the waters of Egypt; and the frogs came up, and covered the land of Egypt.

Exodus 8:7

And the magicians did so with their enchantments, and brought up frogs upon the land of Egypt.

Exodus 8:8

Then Pharaoh called for Moses and Aaron, and said, Intreat Ahayah, that he may take away the frogs from me, and from my people; and I will let the people go, that they may do sacrifice unto Ahayah.

Exodus 8:9

And Moses said unto Pharaoh, Glory over me: when shall I intreat for thee, and for thy servants, and for thy people, to destroy the frogs from thee and thy houses, that they may remain in the river only?

Exodus 8:10

And he said, **To morrow.** And he said, Be it according to thy word: that thou mayest know that there is none like unto Ahayah our Alahayim.

Exodus 8:11

And the frogs shall depart from thee, and from thy houses, and from thy servants, and from thy people; they shall remain in the river only.

Exodus 8:12

And Moses and Aaron went out from Pharaoh: and Moses cried unto Ahayah because of the frogs which he had brought against Pharaoh.

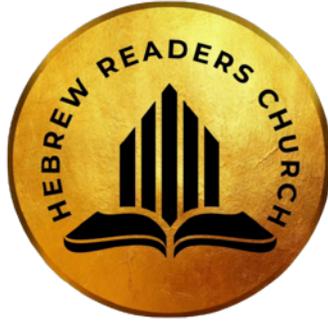
Exodus 8:13

And Ahayah did according to the word of Moses; and the frogs died out of the houses, out of the villages, and out of the fields.

Exodus 8:14

And they gathered them together upon heaps: and the land stank.

Exodus 8:15



But when Pharaoh saw that there was respite, he hardened his heart, and hearkened not unto them; as Ahayah had said.

Exodus 8:16

And Ahayah said unto Moses, Say unto Aaron, Stretch out thy rod, and smite the dust of the land, that it may become lice throughout all the land of Egypt.

Exodus 8:17

And they did so; for Aaron stretched out his hand with his rod, and smote the dust of the earth, and it became lice in man, and in beast; all the dust of the land became lice throughout all the land of Egypt.

Exodus 8:18

And the magicians did so with their enchantments to bring forth lice, but they could not: so there were lice upon man, and upon beast.

Exodus 8:19

Then the magicians said unto Pharaoh, This is the finger of Alahayim: and Pharaoh's heart was hardened, and he hearkened not unto them; as Ahayah had said.

Exodus 8:20

And Ahayah said unto Moses, Rise up **early in the morning**, and stand before Pharaoh; lo, he cometh forth to the water; and say unto him, Thus saith Ahayah, Let my people go, that they may serve me.

Exodus 8:21

Else, if thou wilt not let my people go, behold, I will send swarms of flies upon thee, and upon thy servants, and upon thy people, and into thy houses: and the houses of the Egyptians shall be full of swarms of flies, and also the ground whereon they are.

Exodus 8:22

And I will sever in that day the land of Goshen, in which my people dwell, that no swarms of flies shall be there; to the end thou mayest know that I am Ahayah in the midst of the earth.

Exodus 8:23

And I will put a division between my people and thy people: to morrow shall this sign be.

Exodus 8:24

And Ahayah did so; and there came a grievous swarm of flies into the house of Pharaoh, and into his servants' houses, and into all the land of Egypt: the land was corrupted by reason of the swarm of flies.

Exodus 8:25

And Pharaoh called for Moses and for Aaron, and said, Go ye, sacrifice to your Alahayim in the land.

Exodus 8:29



And Moses said, Behold, I go out from thee, and I will intreat Ahayah that the swarms of flies may depart from Pharaoh, from his servants, and from his people, **to morrow**: but let not Pharaoh deal deceitfully any more in not letting the people go to sacrifice to Ahayah.

Exodus 8:30

And Moses went out from Pharaoh, and intreated Ahayah.

Exodus 8:31 And Ahayah did according to the word of Moses; and he removed the swarms of flies from Pharaoh, from his servants, and from his people; there remained not one.

- Exodus 8:32

And Pharaoh hardened his heart at this time also, neither would he let the people go.

Exodus 9:1

Then Ahayah said unto Moses, Go in unto Pharaoh, and tell him, Thus saith Ahayah Alahayim of the Hebrews, Let my people go, that they may serve me.

Exodus 9:2

For if thou refuse to let them go, and wilt hold them still,

Exodus 9:3

Behold, the hand of Ahayah is upon thy cattle which is in the field, upon the horses, upon the asses, upon the camels, upon the oxen, and upon the sheep: there shall be a very grievous murrain.

Exodus 9:4

And Ahayah shall sever between the cattle of Israel and the cattle of Egypt: and there shall nothing die of all that is the children's of Israel.

Exodus 9:5

And Ahayah appointed a set time, saying, **To morrow Ahayah shall do this thing in the land.**

Exodus 9:6

And Ahayah did that thing on the morrow, and all the cattle of Egypt died: but of the cattle of the children of Israel died not one.

Exodus 9:7

And Pharaoh sent, and, behold, there was not one of the cattle of the Israelites dead. And the heart of Pharaoh was hardened, and he did not let the people go.

Exodus 9:8

And Ahayah said unto Moses and unto Aaron, Take to you handfuls of ashes of the furnace, and let Moses sprinkle it toward the heaven in the sight of Pharaoh.

Exodus 9:9

And it shall become small dust in all the land of Egypt, and shall be a boil breaking forth with blains upon man, and upon beast, throughout all the land of Egypt.

Exodus 9:10



And they took ashes of the furnace, and stood before Pharaoh; and Moses sprinkled it up toward heaven; and it became a boil breaking forth with blains upon man, and upon beast.

Exodus 9:11

And the magicians could not stand before Moses because of the boils; for the boil was upon the magicians, and upon all the Egyptians.

Exodus 9:12

And Ahayah hardened the heart of Pharaoh, and he hearkened not unto them; as Ahayah had spoken unto Moses.

Exodus 9:13

And Ahayah said unto Moses, **Rise up early in the morning**, and stand before Pharaoh, and say unto him, Thus saith Ahayah Alahayim of the Hebrews, Let my people go, that they may serve me.

Exodus 9:14

For I will at this time send all my plagues upon thine heart, and upon thy servants, and upon thy people; that thou mayest know that there is none like me in all the earth.

Exodus 9:15

For now I will stretch out my hand, that I may smite thee and thy people with pestilence; and thou shalt be cut off from the earth.

Exodus 9:16

And in very deed for this cause have I raised thee up, for to shew in thee my power; and that my name may be declared throughout all the earth.

Exodus 9:17

As yet exaltest thou thyself against my people, that thou wilt not let them go?

Exodus 9:18

Behold, **to morrow about this time** I will cause it to rain a very grievous hail, such as hath not been in Egypt since the foundation thereof even until now.

Exodus 9:22

And Ahayah said unto Moses, Stretch forth thine hand toward heaven, that there may be hail in all the land of Egypt, upon man, and upon beast, and upon every herb of the field, throughout the land of Egypt.

Exodus 9:23


And Moses stretched forth his rod toward heaven: and Ahayah sent thunder and hail, and the fire ran along upon the ground; and Ahayah rained hail upon the land of Egypt.

Exodus 9:24

So there was hail, and fire mingled with the hail, very grievous, such as there was none like it in all the land of Egypt since it became a nation.

Exodus 9:26

Only in the land of Goshen, where the children of Israel were, was there no hail.



Exodus 9:27

And Pharaoh sent, and called for Moses and Aaron, and said unto them, I have sinned this time: Ahayah is righteous, and I and my people are wicked.

Exodus 9:28

Intreat Ahayah (for it is enough) that there be no more mighty thunderings and hail; and I will let you go, and ye shall stay no longer.

Exodus 9:29

And Moses said unto him, As soon as I am gone out of the city, I will spread abroad my hands unto Ahayah; and the thunder shall cease, neither shall there be any more hail; that thou mayest know how that the earth is Ahayah'S.

Exodus 9:33

And Moses went out of the city from Pharaoh, and spread abroad his hands unto Ahayah: and the thunders and hail ceased, and the rain was not poured upon the earth.

Exodus 9:34

And when Pharaoh saw that the rain and the hail and the thunders were ceased, he sinned yet more, and hardened his heart, he and his servants.

Exodus 10:1

And Ahayah said unto Moses, Go in unto Pharaoh: for I have hardened his heart, and the heart of his servants, that I might shew these my signs before him:

Exodus 10:2

And that thou mayest tell in the ears of thy son, and of thy son's son, what things I have wrought in Egypt, and my signs which I have done among them; that ye may know how that I am Ahayah.

Exodus 10:3

And Moses and Aaron came in unto Pharaoh, and said unto him, Thus saith Ahayah Alahayim of the Hebrews, How long wilt thou refuse to humble thyself before me? let my people go, that they may serve me.

Exodus 10:4


Else, if thou refuse to let my people go, behold, **to morrow will I bring the locusts into thy coast:**

Exodus 10:5

And they shall cover the face of the earth, that one cannot be able to see the earth: and they shall eat the residue of that which is escaped, which remaineth unto you from the hail, and shall eat every tree which groweth for you out of the field:

Exodus 10:6

And they shall fill thy houses, and the houses of all thy servants, and the houses of all the Egyptians; which neither thy fathers, nor thy fathers' fathers have seen, since the day that they were upon the earth unto this day. And he turned himself, and went out from Pharaoh.



Exodus 10:7

And Pharaoh's servants said unto him, How long shall this man be a snare unto us? let the men go, that they may serve Ahayah their Alahayim: knowest thou not yet that Egypt is destroyed?

Exodus 10:12

And Ahayah said unto Moses, Stretch out thine hand over the land of Egypt for the locusts, that they may come up upon the land of Egypt, and eat every herb of the land, even all that the hail hath left.

Exodus 10:13

And Moses stretched forth his rod over the land of Egypt, and Ahayah brought an east wind upon the land all that day, and all that night; and when it was morning, the east wind brought the locusts.

Exodus 10:14

And the locusts went up over all the land of Egypt, and rested in all the coasts of Egypt: very grievous were they; before them there were no such locusts as they, neither after them shall be such.

Exodus 10:16

Then Pharaoh called for Moses and Aaron in haste; and he said, I have sinned against Ahayah your Alahayim, and against you.

Exodus 10:17

Now therefore forgive, I pray thee, my sin only this once, and intreat Ahayah your Alahayim, that he may take away from me this death only.

Exodus 10:18

And he went out from Pharaoh, and intreated Ahayah.

Exodus 10:19

And Ahayah turned a mighty strong west wind, which took away the locusts, and cast them into the Red sea; there remained not one locust in all the coasts of Egypt.

Exodus 10:20

But Ahayah hardened Pharaoh's heart, so that he would not let the children of Israel go.

Exodus 10:21


And Ahayah said unto Moses, Stretch out thine hand toward heaven, that there may be darkness over the land of Egypt, even darkness which may be felt.

Exodus 10:22

And Moses stretched forth his hand toward heaven; and there was a thick darkness in all the land of Egypt three days:

Jasher 80

36. And Alahayim sent darkness upon Egypt, that the whole land of Egypt and Pathros became dark for three days, so that a man could not see his hand when he lifted it to his



mouth. 37. At that time died many of the people of Israel who had rebelled against Ahayah and who would not hearken to Moses and Aaron, and believed not in them that Alahayim had sent them. 38. Those, who would not hearken to the voice of Moses had, had said, we will not go forth from Egypt lest we perish from hunger in a desolate wilderness. 39. And Ahayah plagued them in the three days of darkness, and the Israelites buried them in those days without the Egyptians knowing of them or rejoicing over them. 40. And the darkness was very great in Egypt for three days, and any person who was standing when the darkness came, remained standing in his place, and he that was sitting, remained sitting, and he that was lying continued lying in the same state, and he that was walking remained sitting upon the ground in the same spot; and this thing happened to all the Egyptians, until the darkness had passed away.

41. And the days of darkness passed away, and Ahayah sent Moses and Aaron to the children of Israel, saying, celebrate your feast and prepare your Passover, for behold I come in the midst of the night amongst all the Egyptians, and I will smite all their firstborn, from the firstborn of a man to the firstborn of a beast, and when I see your Passover, I will pass over you. 42. And the children of Israel did according to all that Ahayah had commanded Moses and Aaron, thus did they in that night

Exodus 12:1

And Ahayah spake unto Moses and Aaron in the land of Egypt, saying,

Exodus 12:2

This month shall be unto you the beginning of months: it shall be the first month of the year to you.

Exodus 12:3

Speak ye unto all the congregation of Israel, saying, In the tenth day of this month they shall take to them every man a lamb, according to the house of their fathers, a lamb for an house:

Exodus 12:6

And ye shall keep it up until the fourteenth day of the same month: and the whole assembly of the congregation of Israel shall kill it in the evening.


Exodus 12:11 And thus shall ye eat it; with your loins girded, your shoes on your feet, and your staff in your hand; and ye shall eat it in haste: it is Ahayah'S passover.

Exodus 12:12

For I will pass through the land of Egypt this night, and will smite all the firstborn in the land of Egypt, both man and beast; and against all the alahayims of Egypt I will execute judgment: I am Ahayah.

Exodus 12:13

And the blood shall be to you for a token upon the houses where ye are: and when I see the blood, I will pass over you, and the plague shall not be upon you to destroy you, when I smite the land of Egypt.



Exodus 12:14

And this day shall be unto you for a memorial; and ye shall keep it a feast to Ahayah throughout your generations; ye shall keep it a feast by an ordinance for ever.

Exodus 12:21

Then Moses called for all the elders of Israel, and said unto them, Draw out and take you a lamb according to your families, and kill the passover.

Exodus 12:24

And ye shall observe this thing for an ordinance to thee and to thy sons for ever.

Exodus 12:28

And the children of Israel went away, and did as Ahayah had commanded Moses and Aaron, so did they.

Exodus 12:29

And it came to pass, that at midnight Ahayah smote all the firstborn in the land of Egypt, from the firstborn of Pharaoh that sat on his throne unto the firstborn of the captive that was in the dungeon; and all the firstborn of cattle.

Jubilees 49:2-6

2. For on this night--the beginning of the festival and the beginning of the joy--ye were eating the Passover in Egypt, when all the powers of Mastêmâ had been let loose to slay all the first-born in the land of Egypt, from the firstborn of Pharaoh to the first-born of the captive maidservant in the mill, and to the cattle. 3. And this is the sign which Ahayah gave them: Into every house on the lintels of which they saw the blood of a lamb of the first year, into (that) house they should not enter to slay, but should pass by (it), that all those should be saved that were in the house because the sign of the blood was on its lintels. 4. And the powers of Ahayah did everything according as Ahayah commanded them, and they passed by all the children of Israel, and the plague came not upon them to destroy from amongst them any soul either of cattle, or man, or dog. 5. And the plague was very grievous in Egypt, and there was no house in Egypt where there was not one dead, and weeping and lamentation. 6. And all Israel was eating the flesh of the paschal lamb, and drinking the wine, and was lauding and blessing, and giving thanks to Ahayah Alahayim of their fathers, and was ready to go forth from under the yoke of Egypt; and from the evil bondage.
